- There are a number of training opportunities some which are at no charge and others that have a fee (at your own cost)

FREE COLLEGE CREDIT COURSE - Introduction to Community Policing

- If you are interested in learning about policing this course is a perfect opportunity

- This course will introduce students to community policing concepts and law enforcement procedures. Among the many topics covered include: the criminal justice process, police ethics, use of force, arrest procedures, and much more. The course is designed to prepare students to successfully pass the entrance exam to the police academy, a first step on the path to becoming a police officer with SPD.

- Students can apply to the school and enroll in CPP 101: Intro to Community Policing either online or in person. Please note that non-matriculated students still need to come to school in person to register, even if they apply online.
